EMASS is a popular and friendly arena for postgraduate researchers specialising in archaeological and interdisciplinary approaches to the early medieval period in Europe and beyond. EMASS 2015 will be hosted by the University of Oxford and held at the Ioannou Centre.

We welcome contributions, both papers and posters, from postgraduate students, post-doctoral researchers and early career lecturers. These should focus on the early medieval period ranging from the 4th to the 12th centuries AD. EMASS has always been interdisciplinary in its nature and we encourage submissions from a range of disciplines.

Please note the deadline for abstract submissions is Friday 27th February 2015.

EMASS 2015 is calling for:

- **Individual Papers: 20 minutes long and followed by a 10 minute discussion.**
- **Sessions: We welcome session proposals for 2 or 3 papers linked by a common theme.**
- **Posters: A1 or A2 in size.**

- Session organiser's name, affiliation and contact details.

Individual Poster Proposals:

- Title of poster
- Poster Abstract (250 words max)
- Researcher's name, affiliation and contact details.
- Posters should be A1 or A2 size

Please note that whilst we welcome delegates and presenters from around the world, this is an English-language conference and all correspondence and presentations must be in English.
